# Absences

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You can help us tremendously by letting us know as soon as possible if your child is absent from school. ☆ Please note that if we have not heard from you the school office will contact you asking you to let us know  $\star$  the reason for your child's absence.

Can I also ask that on your child's return to school, following a period of absence, that a note is provided for ★ the class teacher. This is necessary even if you have telephoned while your child was off, as we require this information for our records.

All of these procedures are in place to help ensure the safety of our children and I thank you in advance for your co-operation with these. A copy of the school's attendance information can be downloaded from the school website.



### Safetv First

For Health & Safety reasons jewellery should not be worn on gym days. If you cannot remove your child's earrings could I ask that you provide him/her with plasters to cover them.



### **Road Safety**

★ Can I ask for everyone's co-operation in ensuring our car park is a safe place for our children. Please park ★ only in designated bays when dropping off and collecting your child. Please also consider parking out with \* the school car park (Park and Stride) and walking part of the journey to help ease congestion. You could ★ make use of the Murray Square Shops, the Stroud or the Murray Centre. If there are a number of you  $\star$  travelling from the same area, you might consider car sharing.

#### $\mathbf{x}$ Please do not walk your child through the vehicular entrance or across the car park. Always use $\star$ the pathways and zebra crossings.

We would also like to gently remind you that our staff car park is for staff only and due to the number of staff in the school all spaces can be used up daily. For the safety of all I would like to ask that you do not stand in the car park and that you use the pavements if you are waiting in the school grounds.

At the end of the school day, we have opened up the ramp to ease congestion and provide more opportunities to park, but this is one-way only and we would ask that no one reverse out of the school if they are at the back of the queue.

Our school travel plan was launched last year and we continue to use this to support road safety measures in and around the school. The following measures have been implemented since it began:

- The school continues to publicise advice to all parents/carers about road safety through the school website, newsletters, school app and Twitter
- Signs are used to show the safe way into the school and to promote road safety
- Junior Road safety Officers and their patrollers are on hand in the morning to walk your child in to • school by the safest route
- Police have been contacted to assist with difficult situations but are not always able to attend
- Zig-zag lines and the yellow box have been re-painted •
- Voluntary one way system at the end of the school day for extra parking continues •
- Part time 20mph speed limit signs have been put up on the Murray Road •
- Our curriculum includes lessons and opportunities for pupils to engage in road safety discussions

 $\star$  At the end of last term, we tried to implement a Walking Bus but unfortunately, we only had two volunteers  $\star$  who put themselves forward to do this.  $\star$  We will ask again for volunteers this term and try to see if we can get enough people to set up this option.

Our Junior Road Safety Officers continue to attend all meetings and opportunities to raise awareness of road safety in and around the school.

#### Promoting Positive Behaviour and Relationships

St Louise positive behaviour policy encourages pupils to aim for high standards in behaviour, work and effort - in class, in the playground, in the cafeteria and when representing St Louise as part of a team or on a class trip.

The system also encourages the children to follow our three basic school rules:

- Be kind, respectful and helpful •
- Keep your hands, feet and objects to yourself

### **Gentle Reminders**

### ★ Head lice

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☆ Can I remind you to check your child's hair for head lice on a fairly regular basis? The guidance suggests st that parents/carers should aim to check their children's hair once a week during normal hair washing. ☆ Information leaflets with useful advice and guidance are available at your local pharmacy. You can also access useful advice from www.onceaweektakeapeek.com. Please do not hesitate to contact us if we can provide any further help.

### **Holidays**

Can I ask you to avoid taking your child out of school for holidays during term time please? This can be very disruptive to your child's education as they miss valuable teaching input when they are absent. These absences are recorded as 'Unauthorised' (except in very exceptional circumstances) and do not help us present a positive picture in relation to our annual absence data.

### Screw on Water Bottles

We want to encourage children to drink water throughout the day as we are aware of the potential benefits of doing so. Children can bring their own full water bottle into school with them and we do have a water

 $\star$  point where bottles can be refilled if necessary. It would help immensely if you could try and use water st bottles with a secure lid that only requires a flip open as many of the younger children are struggling with 🖈 screw on tops. Unless there is a medical reason why your child needs an alternative to plain water, only plain water is permitted in your child's bottle.

### Pets

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Please note that pets are not permitted on school grounds except those who are needed for assistance. If you have a pet, and are collecting your child, could we ask you to do so from outside the school gate.

### **Scooters and Bikes**

Please note that, if children are bringing scooters or bikes to school, they should dismount at the school gates and walk with their scooter/bike when in the school grounds. When leaving, they should walk their scooter/bike out and only get on it once out of the school gates. This is important for the health and safety of those in the playground. We will reiterate this rule to the children but would appreciate your support in reminding them of it.

### **End of Day Arrangements**

To help with a smoother pick up at the end of the day it would be helpful if your child knew in advance who ☆ is picking them up and what the arrangements are. We understand that emergencies do occur and in this  $\star$  instance you can contact the school office.

#### ☆ ☆ Main Office

✤ For the safety of all pupils and staff, I would ask that parents/carers come through the  $\star$  main office door for any queries or information.



### **Breakfast Club / School Playground**

Please bear in mind that our breakfast club starts at 8.15am and there is no adult supervision in the school until this time. For insurance and safety purposes we would ask that you drop your children off at the side entrance to the dining hall and the breakfast club volunteers will be on hand to support your child. To avoid children being late for class starting, we would ask that no child is later than 8.40am for breakfast.

Playground supervision also doesn't start until 8.30am and for safety reasons, we would ask that children are dropped off or arrive at school as near to these times as possible.

### Nut Allergies

Due to the increase of children with severe nut allergies, can I ask you not to provide nut products as a snack or part of a packed lunch.
