CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

St Louise Parent and Staff Group is the Parent Council of St Louise Primary School and as a St Louise Primary pupil's parent/carer, you automatically become a member of what's called the Parent Forum.

What do we do?

What did we do in 2017 - 2018?

- Held regular meetings that were open to all parents/carers and the Minutes of our meetings were added to the school website so that parents could see what had been discussed
- Continued communicating regularly with parents/carers through social media
- Organised several social and fundraising events throughout the year, including our Halloween disco, Christmas fayre, St Louise feast day disco and our Summer fayre
- We worked collaboratively with Heathery Knowe Primary and various bodies within South Lanarkshire Council to tackle road safety in and around our schools. This will be an ongoing campaign to continually monitor the situation at both schools
- We have provided St Louise Primary with funds to update their netball uniforms, paid for online subscriptions to enhance the learning of our children, bought P1 water bottles, paid for the P7 trip, leavers hoodies and pizza lunch. We also presented the school with a cheque for £1000.

What do we plan to do in 2018 - 2019?

- Promote PSG more, to encourage more parents/carers to be involved so that we have as wide a selection of parents/carers views as possible
- Be an active part of school events by attending and supporting them

School News

The recent newsletter that was issued to all families can be downloaded from the school website or additional copies picked up from the school office. It included a lot of information on dates for the coming year and school events and information.

Transition information for P7 has now been finalised and shared which shows a clash with our proposed Halloween disco (30th October) and may now need to be changed.

We have had a huge response to the after school reading club and will now work with Mrs Cooper to get this up and running.

We think South Lanarkshire Leisure have secured an athletics coach for the school to support the competitions the children have entered but await confirmation of this.

Our school have now received our reading passports and as part of the First Minister's Reading Challenge we will be issuing these to all pupils to record what they read across the year. Our children are already very avid readers and we would like to develop this further.

Our first 'Find Out' session is this Friday 28th September – all welcome.

As part of our reading priority this session we have organised an author visit for P1-3 in November and will also plan a similar event for P4-7.

In January we will have a full day's input and workshops for each class on hand washing and hygiene from the student nurses at UWS.

Pope Francis Faith Award continues with all children eager to take part. The workbooks have arrived for P6 and they will now work through the programme.

Massive congratulations to our P7 pupils, Mrs Docherty and their families as they came first in the Sumdog competition over Maths Week Scotland and have now been invited to Scottish Parliament to receive an award from John Swinney.

We recently launched our whole school pupil focus groups where every child in the school is part of a school improvement group looking at different priorities including Literacy, Numeracy, HWB, Family Engagement, ICT, RE, Languages, STEM, School Grounds, ECO and Fairtrade. They really enjoyed discussing their focus in their groups and have come up with some really great ideas to take forward.

Our school are also signed up to the 'Free Books for Schools' Campaign and would ask anyone who reads the Sun to support this by handing in the printed vouchers to the school.
