

Primary 1– Please find below some activities to do across the week

Literacy	 This week's common words are: make, like, made Try to write the words in lots of fun ways- rainbow colours, bubble writing, big writing, small writing etc. Write a sentence or two about your week in your jotter. Remember to try your best to sound out your words. It doesn't need to be perfect! Phonics – practise writing all of your single letters sounds. You could use your phonics board, pens, chalk etc. Try to log on to topmarks website, click on learning games (5-7) and then select English. There are lots of different games to help you with your phonics. <u>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/english-games/5-7-years/letters-and-sounds</u> Read a book you have at home or an online story -
Numeracy	 Have a go at counting in 5s. This is tricky so ask an adult or older sibling to do it with you. 0,5,10,15,20,25,30,35,40,45,50 Write out the number pattern Complete the maths games in your Education City Class folder. Position and movement – try to play games and make use of the vocabulary of movement such as forward, backward, turn, left and right. Perhaps you could make an obstacle course and guide your family through it using these words. Or you could draw a treasure map and give directions using the words.
ICT	 Have a go at typing your common words Make use of the games in your education city class folder Play with a remote control toy (if you have one) and think about how this links with the movement words you have in your numeracy learning.
RE	 Saturday 9th May was the feast of our school patron St Louise. Can you show your family some of the values St Louise showed in her life such as caring for others, kindness, patience, sharing. In school we would have celebrated with a disco – perhaps you and your family could have a mini disco at home.
PE	 Use Jumpstart Jonny, PE with Joe, Cosmic Kids Yoga, Go Noodle to do PE indoors Play outdoors if you have a garden and try to go for a daily walk (remember to follow social distancing rules)
Key worker topic	This week I would like you to think about people who work as carers. They might work in a care home or visit people in their own homes. Talk about – what they wear, what special equipment they use, who do they help and how do they help them?
French	Mrs Cassidy would like you to keep up the great work you have been doing to learn your numbers and greetings in French. I will add a French classwork folder to your education city to help you practise at home.
