Remember that Monday is a holiday so do what you can on the other days.

Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This week’s common words are – said, big, could. Have a go at finding the words in books at home or by using books online by using websites such as Oxford Owls or Collins Big Cats. • Phonics – explore the sound ‘ai’. Play the games in your education city class folder, find the green ai and place on your phonics board, make words – maid, snail, rain, look out for more ai words in your own books at home. • Watch the story of ‘The Snail and The Whale’ on BBC iPlayer https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/m000cslw/the-snail-and-the-whale Talk about the characters – how would you describe them? Talk about how the characters helped each other, can you make up a story about two different animals helping each other?
Numeracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete the maths games in your Education City Class folder. • Lay out your number cards from 20 back to 0. Practise saying the numbers. Have a go at saying the numbers without using the cards to help you. • Use 4 of your toys - put into 2 groups and write the adding sums you have made. Put all 4 toys back in 1 group. Close your eyes and ask an adult to hide some of the toys. Can you work out how many they took away? Write a subtraction sum to show this.
