### Literacy

Phonics – This week your child will bring home a phonics board. This should now be kept at home (in a safe place) and will be used throughout primary 1 for homework tasks.

Ask your child to use the letters to make, blend, read and write the following words –

as, at, is, it, sit, sat

Reading – Common words – use your own books at home to try to spot the common words we have been learning –

a, at, the, I, is, it

Use the oxford owls website (free ebooks) – Read together and discuss –

Dad's Birthday and other stories – 'Floppy Did This'

### Numeracy

Continue to practise counting forwards to 30 and backwards from 20.

Use toys or objects to show our 'Learn-it' sums –

$$1 + 1 = 2$$

$$2 + 2 = 4$$

Have a go at writing the sums on your whiteboard or in your jotter. Ask someone at home to test you on how well you know the answers to these sums.

#### Health And Wellbeing

## SAINTS FUN FACTS

St. Louise de Marillac was born in France in 1591. She met St. Vincent de Paul and he became her spiritual advisor. She helped direct the Ladies of Charity, caring for the poor and neglected. She helped form the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul and took her own vows in 1634. By the time of her death the Congregation had more than fifty homes in France.
