Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• This week's spelling words are: Capital Letters: thought, brought, fought, bought; Full Stops: make, like, made.• Write a story or poem, using as many of your spelling words as you can. Draw a picture to illustrate it. Remember to use adjectives to describe the nouns.• Read a book, magazine or online story for 20 minutes each day. Look at www.oxfordowl.co.uk for new books to read and try some of the activities too.• Complete some of the Literacy work on Education City, either Capital Letters or Full Stops folder. I have added more activities!
Numeracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use a clock to tell the time to the hour eg 5 to 9, 20 to 3 etc• Use a TV guide to create a viewing schedule for 2 hours and 15 minutes of television. Use the start and finish times for each programme to calculate their duration. List the programmes you could watch.• Practise tables using Hit the Button on www.topmarks.co.uk• Continue with the Measure and Time activities on Education City – remember to click on CLASSWORK.
ICT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Coding: www.code.org click LEARN AT HOME and choose one (or more) of the activities to do. I know this is new, just try your best!• Sumdog - Maths, Spelling and Grammar activities
RE	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Children's Liturgy for seventh Sunday of Easter as we can't go to Mass https://youtu.be/oMVmyuLYUrE• Say the prayer you wrote last week to Our Lady every day.
PE	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use PE with Joe, Cosmic Kids Yoga, Jumpstart Johnny or Go Noodle to do PE indoors.• Play outdoors as much as you can.
Other things to do	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When you are on your daily walk, collect some leaves, petals, twigs etc and make a nature art picture when you get home.• Do a blindfolded 'What fruit or vegetable is this?' quiz, using your hands to explore the different textures.• Watch Newsround and choose some BBC Bitesize programmes to watch.• Drama: Choose a favourite story or book. Read the opening line, the very first sentence. Create a drama based on this sentence. Write it out and/or illustrate it. Act out one of the characters using a big loud voice with lots of expression.
