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Dates and Times...



- Pupils start on Wednesday 17th of August.
- Pupils and parents will be given a staggered start time from 9.15am and will enter through the dining room door - children will then be taken to class by a member of staff
- Each start time will be 10 minutes to allow the settling in process
- End of first day Buddies to help get children ready teachers will bring children to pick up point - front playground area
- After the first day children will line up as usual in the playground – children to be dropped off at main gate or ramp

The first week...



Day 1

- children and parents will come at their allocated time through the dining room door and can take pictures here
- Staff will be on hand to take children to the class there will be dining tables out for parents/carers to sit with their child if they need time to settle
- Children will have a tour of the school and be shown where everything is
- They will complete settling in tasks to ensure they feel comfortable in their new environment
- They will meet their buddies and have their first playtime later/earlier than the whole school
- Buddies will have lunch with them
- The first day is an opportunity for the teacher to get to know the children more

Days 2-5

- Children have access to the free breakfast club from 8.15am
- If not attending the breakfast club they can arrive at school from 8.30am onwards
- Children will now line up in the playground and enter the school via the P1 door
- They will begin to experience more structured learning activities that will ease them into the routines of the Primary 1 classroom
- Get to know each other
- The week will be focused on routines to ensure children are aware of what is expected of them

A typical day/week in Primary 1 ...



- Children in Primary 1 will start their day with a table top activity or soft start
- This gives children an opportunity to settle into the school day
- Each day across the week children will be provided with different engaging opportunities to experience learning in Literacy, Numeracy, Health and Wellbeing, Expressive Arts, Social Studies, Science, Technologies and RME.
- Break time is 10:25 10:40 (children can bring a snack healthy)
- Lunch time is 12:10-12:55 (School Dinners / Packed Lunches)



In the first 4 weeks children will do a lot of work on phonological awareness



Reading

- "The more you**read** the more **things** you know. The more that you **earn** the more **baces** you'll go." -Dr. Seuss
- Once the children have a bank of new sounds, blending is introduced.
- Blending is when letters are joined to make words
- Children will build sight vocabulary of common words they are introduced to (Flashcards/Word Displays/Word Tins)
- They will use blending, sight vocabulary and pictures to help them to begin reading.





Writing

- Pencil grip is very important
- Formation of the letters is very important
- Children should start their letters at the correct point and follow around the correct way
- Children will start to write single letters and common words
- Once they gain confidence with this they will move onto writing a sentence

How can you help?

- Lots of chatter!
- Opportunities to find letters and sounds in the environment / world around them
- Songs and rhymes
- Sharing stories / lots of talk about the pictures (reading to them)
- Encouraging children to 'tell' stories
- Pencil grip
- Colouring
- Letter formation lots of different ways to do it (shaving foam / squeezy bottles / play dough)
- Word walls
- Homework (guidance pack)
- *Workshops in new term*

Numerals

- Children will only be introduced to numerals once they have shown that they are aware that numerals represent quantities.
- Like letter formation, number formation is **very** important. Children will be shown how to correctly write the numerals.





Health and Wellbeing



- Children will be supported daily to build positive relationships with other children and with the adults in the school. Whole school nurture approach.
- They will be introduced to different emotions and how to cope through stories and poems.



• Children get to know the characters in the story and can relate the story to their own experiences.



Physical Education

- Children will have 2 hours a week of physical education.
- Children bring their PE kit in on the first day of the week in a drawstring bag and change into it on the days they are getting PE- Practise doing this at home
- Blue shorts, blue, grey or black plain leggings or plain joggers, t-shirt.
- They use their indoor gym shoes for PE
- **Please put names on everything!**



Homework

- Homework is issued on a Monday and returned by Friday.
- There will be a different focus for learning.
- Spelling and phonics will be included each week
- Reading should be practised every night. (This will help build children's sight vocabulary)
- Maths will be issued once a week
- Any other area the teacher would like to focus on
