Learning in the social studies will enable me to learn how to locate, explore and link features and places locally and further a field

 To extend my mental map and sense of place, I can interpret information from different types of maps and am beginning to locate key features within Scotland, UK, Europe or the wider world. SOC 2-14a

Making and using maps

I can:

- Give and follow directions for increasingly complex routes
- Use 8 point compass rose to identify features in relationship to a given point
- Follow 8 point compass directions to insert a symbol on a map or plan
- Locate the appropriate square on a map using two figure grid references
- Locate a <u>point</u> on a map using two figure grid references ie 6, 7
- Begin to use conventions for the writing of 4 figure grid references ie 03, 11
- Plot points using 4 figure grid references on a map or grid
- Use an index to identify grid references and then locate places or features on maps of Britain or Europe (use alphabetical order to 2 places)
- Enlarge and reduce shapes/ plans using different sized grids (grids to be marked off in centimetres)
- Use grid overlays to reduce features on pictures and record on smaller size maps
- Transfer information from more detailed pictures to map and use colour coding key to make a simple land use map eg houses, shops, flats, factories, bus and train stations
- Use simple mapping conventions to indicate up hill and down hill (eg arrows pointing up/down)
- Continue with sketching map "interpretations" of pictures of increasing detail using symbols, key and title
- Use a variety of maps to obtain information about routes eg road maps, rail maps
- Locate the bodies of water around Britain ie North Sea, Irish Sea, English Channel and Atlantic Ocean

- Locate the main islands and island groups around Britain i.e.
 Orkney, Shetland, Outer Hebrides, Inner Hebrides, Isle of Wight,
 Isle of Man, Channel Islands, Isles of Scilly, Anglesey,
- Locate the main cities of England i.e. London, Liverpool, Manchester etc
- Locate the rivers Thames, Tyne, Severn, Humber, Mersey on the map of England
- Locate the English towns and cities listed plus Aberdeen, Glasgow, Edinburgh, Perth, Inverness on a map of Britain.

I know

- That if the box is twice as big the image will be twice as big, if the box is half as big the image will be half as big
- The names of the bodies of water around Britain i.e. North Sea, Irish Sea, English Channel and Atlantic Ocean
- The names of the main island groups and islands around Britain i.e. Orkney, Shetland, Outer Hebrides, Inner Hebrides, Isle of Wight, Isle of Man, Channel Islands, Isles of Scilly, Anglesey,
- That a continent is a landmass usually consisting of a group countries
- That the continents are Europe, Asia, Africa, Australasia (Oceania), North America, South America, Antarctica,
- That the continents are not individual countries i.e. Africa is a continent, South Africa is a country
